We also had a special Anti-bullying week assembly from Ijaz Chaudry, our local Police Support Officer, who then visited each class to talk about the variety of roles that are available in the police force. Each class has also been involved in lots of different activities about how to keep safe online. As well as this, our school councillors have been involved in talking to their classes about items to put in a time capsule that will be buried under the Wetmore Road Community Centre in collaboration with our local parish council as part of our continuing work around the community!
