Maths

Children will be following the Inspire scheme of work which is closely linked to mathematics in Singapore.

D2 will be covering multiplication, division and shape.

M1/2 will be using positional language and ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd 3rd) Later in the half term they will focus on place value and comparing numbers.

J/B1 will focus on solving subtraction by counting on and taking away. Later they will be using positional language and ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd 3rd)

Science

The children will be learning to: Identify and name a variety of common animals that are birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles, mammals and invertebrates.

- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles, mammals and invertebrates. including pets).
- Notice that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.
- Investigate and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).



Geography / History

Our topic this year will be all about farm animals. We will... Investigate how farms have changed over time, looking at the machinery, clothing, land use and investigate artefacts such as butter pats, milk churn etc.

We will identify the key features of different locations in order to sav whether it is a city, town, village, coastal or rural area.

PE

This half term, the children will be developing their gymnastic skills through floor work on mats and on the large apparatus.

As well as this, they will also be improving their throwing and catching skills in order to play simple field games.

Daily phonics and guided reading sessions will support children's reading and spellings skills.

Computing

Art / D&T

In Art the children will explore animal patterns as inspiration for their own printing ideas. They will sketch patterns and then create their own printing blocks using a variety of different techniques.

In DT we will explore how we can create animal patterns using a paint package on the computer.
