Collaboration games and partner work e.g throwing, rolling, fetching and receiving games, Use tools for cooking- cheese snakes, fruit salad, egg sandwiches,

Use scissors independently to snip or cut out shapes,

Develop a good pen grip to write letters of their name,

Make up their own games using equipment and involve their friends in play,

Learn how to keep safe when in different environments like the farm.

Blending & segmenting sounds we hear in words,

Mathematics

Matching numerals to quantities of farm animals.

Look at numerals in the environment and count things we see like different colour cars.

Describe and follow a route around our outdoor learning area,

Compare fruit by their weight or size, Complete repeating patterns using fruits- apple, grape, apple, grape, Use 'first', 'then' to sequence events from our stories,
