

## PE, Sports and Sports Premium 2018/19

### **Christ Church Primary School PE and Sport Vision Statement**

At Christ Church Primary School, we believe that Physical Education and Sport play a vital role in the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of children. Physical Education and sport are central in giving children the knowledge and understanding in order to make a positive impact on their own health and well-being. The physical education curriculum at Christ Church aims to provide children with the opportunity to take part in a range of sports and physical activities, carried out in a safe and supportive environment, where effort and hard-work, as well as success, is celebrated.

#### **National Curriculum Aims**

- Competent pupils able to excel in a broad range of physical activities.
- Pupils have the ability to be physically active for sustained periods of time.
- Pupils to be able to engage in competitive sports and activities.
- Pupils to be supported to lead healthy and active lifestyles.

## Sports Premium 2018/19

The primary 'sport premium' funding for primary schools has been designed to help schools in a variety of ways. Some of the outcomes we hope to meet through the 'sport premium' are:

- Improvements in the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including 'increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of'.
- Improved quality of teaching and learning in primary physical education, including more dynamic and sustained exercise in lessons.
- Increased opportunities for competitive sport.
- Develop the range of sporting activities offered.
- Foster links with local sporting clubs.

#### How the Sports Premium is being used at Christ Church

- Providing coaches from local clubs for after school sports clubs to improve 'Pupil
   Engagement' and providing opportunities for exciting physical activities in school time.
   This allows pupils to have access to a range of after school activities linked to a variety of sports his allows us to have engaging and active lunchtimes and provides opportunities for pupils to take part in a variety of sports (£6780)
- Buying new equipment to improve resources within the school. Allowing the children to
  have access to high quality resources will improved their attitudes towards PE and help
  staff to deliver quality lessons (£7592.03)
- Buying into the 'Robert Sutton School Sports Partnership'. This provides us with access to high quality training, advice and provision for PE (£1500)
- Expand surfacing for the playground and outdoor canopy contribution for Reception. This
  allows more space for active lessons, playtimes and lunchtimes throughout the year to
  engage more pupils as well as adding a new dimension to PE lessons (£13629.62)
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport. This allows staff to develop their skills in delivering high quality PE (£321.10)
- Costs for attendance at sports festivals. This will allow pupils to attend various sporting tournaments throughout the local area. (£630)

- Purchase of a trophy cabinet to display sporting success in main reception area. This has enabled us to showcase our great achievements in sport since 2013. (£421)
- Purchase of Bikeability sets for Reception to improve coordination, balance and strength for reception pupils to provide them with the skills required for riding a bike (£1030)

## **Impact of the Sports Premium at Christ Church**

- We have introduced a variety of Sports into the school curriculum this year, including Boccia
- Daily lunchtime activities continue to be implemented for all year groups throughout the year, including football, basketball and cricket. This has been led by staff from Burton Albion
- The PE leader has received training in Handball and Tennis. New equipment for Handball,
   Dodgeball and Boccia has been purchased
- The Robert Sutton Partnership provides many opportunities for training for staff as well as competitions for pupils to participate in. Staff have received training in Handball and Dance and pupils have entered a variety of competitions including: Boccia, Football, Dodgeball, Handball and QuickSticks
- The additional outdoor space has provided excellent opportunities for pupil engagement at
  playtimes and lunchtimes, enabling them to keep active in a variety of ways such as hula
  hooping, skipping, basketball, football and climbing

#### **Sports Premium Success at Christ Church**

Since changing status from an Infant school to a Primary in 2013 Christ Church has had tremendous success in local competitions thanks to the Sports Premium Grant. #### **Swimming Outcomes 2018-19**

All Y3 children attend swimming lessons at the Meadowside Leisure Centre and are taught by swimming teachers in differentiated groups. Travel to the pool and the cost of lessons is paid for by the school. Every child in Y3 receives thirty 45 minute lessons over the course of the year.

The number of Y6 pupils meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m using a range of strokes effectively and performing safe self-rescue in different water-based situations for the 2018-19 academic year is 35/44 pupils (79.5%)
