- Foster links with local sporting clubs.

How the Sports Premium is being used at Christ Church

- Providing coaches from local clubs for after school sports clubs to improve 'Pupil
 Engagement'. This will allow pupils to have access to a range of after school activities
 linked to a variety of sports.
- Providing opportunities for exciting physical activities in school time. This will allow us to
 have engaging and active lunchtimes and provided opportunities for pupils to take part in a
 variety of sports.
- Professional development opportunities in PE/sport. This will allow staff to develop their skills in delivering high quality PE.
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport.
- Costs for attendance at sports festivals. This will allow pupils to attend various sporting tournaments throughout the local area.
- Buying new PE equipment to improve resources within the school. Allowing the children to
 have access to high quality resources will improved their attitudes towards PE and help
 staff to deliver quality lessons.
- Buying into the 'Robert Sutton School Sports Partnership' for access to high quality training, advice and provision for PE.
