Christ Church Primary School PE and Sport Vision Statement

At Christ Church Primary School, we believe that Physical Education and Sport play a vital role in the physical, social, emotional and intellectual development of children. Physical Education and sport are central in giving children the knowledge and understanding in order to make a positive impact on their own health and well- being. The physical education curriculum at Christ Church aims to provide children with the opportunity to take part in a range of sports and physical activities, carried out in a safe and supportive environment, where effort and hard-work, as well as success, is celebrated.

National Curriculum Aims

- Competent pupils able to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Pupils have the ability to be physically active for sustained periods of time
- Pupils to be able to engage in competitive sports and activities
- Pupils to be supported to lead healthy and active lifestyles

Sports Premium 2020/21

The primary 'sport premium' funding for primary schools has been designed to help schools in a variety of ways. Some of the outcomes we hope to meet through the 'sport premium' are:

- Improvements in the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including 'increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of'
- Ensuring that pupils have a positive approach to physical activity during periods of remote learning
- Improved quality of teaching and learning in primary physical education, including more dynamic and sustained exercise in lessons
- Increased opportunities for competitive sport
- Develop the range of sporting activities offered
- Foster links with local sporting clubs

How the Sports Premium is being used at Christ Church (July 2021)

- Providing coaches from local clubs for lunchtime school sports clubs to improve 'Pupil Engagement' and providing opportunities for exciting physical activities in school time.
 - This allows pupils to have access to a range of after school activities linked to a variety of sports his allows us to have engaging and active lunchtimes and provides opportunities for pupils to take part in a variety of sports (£5670)
- Buying into the 'Robert Sutton School Sports Partnership'. This provides us with access to high quality training, advice and provision for PE (£1500)
- Purchasing a new scheme of work and accompanying resources to allow staff to deliver high quality PE lessons confidently (£2160)
- Purchasing T-shirts for pupils to use when representing the school during future sports events (£191)

- Buying new equipment to improve the number of resources within the school.
 Allowing the children to have access to high quality resources will improved their attitudes towards PE and help staff to deliver quality lessons (£767.95)
- Providing opportunities for disadvantaged pupils to attend Summer Sports School (£503)
- Ensuring PE equipment is meeting Health and Safety requirements (£2566.10)

Impact of the Sports Premium at Christ Church

- Daily lunchtime activities continue to be implemented for Y6 group during the Covid-19 pandemic. This has been led by staff from Burton Albion
- The Robert Sutton Partnership provides opportunities for training for staff as well as virtual competitions for pupils to participate in. Staff have received online training via Zoom and Microsoft Teams
- New equipment for basketball, rugby and football has been purchased which has allowed teachers to teach more effectively during Covid-19. Each class has sets of equipment just for their class to minimise transmission
- Complete PE Scheme is currently being implemented across the school and its success will be reviewed in the Summer term 2021
- T-shirts will ensure children have pride when representing the school in inter-school competitions, though this has not had any impact yet due to Covid-19
- The new equipment has enabled staff to deliver effective PE lessons without having to share equipment in light of Covid-19
- Disadvantaged pupils have enjoyed developing their sporting skills during the summer holiday
- All equipment meets Health and Safety requirements, enabling teachers to deliver
 PE effectively with sufficient resources

Sports Premium Success at Christ Church

Since changing status from an Infant school to a Primary in 2013 Christ Church has had tremendous success in local competitions thanks to the Sports Premium Grant. Swimming Outcomes 2020-21

All Y3 children attend swimming lessons at the Meadowside Leisure Centre and are taught by swimming teachers in differentiated groups. Travel to the pool and the cost of lessons is paid for by the school. Every child in Y3 receives thirty 45-minute lessons over the course of a normal year. However, this has been severely impacted by Covid-19 and no lessons have taken place for this academic year.

The number of current Y6 pupils meeting the national curriculum requirement to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m is 24/40 (60%); using a range of strokes effectively is 27/40 (67.5%) and performing safe self-rescue in different water-based situations is 11/40 (27.5%) for the 2020-21 academic year.

Reporting

The Headteacher will report to governors on the impact of sports funding annually and the report will be on the school website for parents to view.
