

#### Dear Families,

School is continuing to make its preparations to be open for all children following the Prime Minister's announcement last Monday when he confirmed that all children will return to school on **Monday 8th March**. Nursery children will continue to attend their timetabled morning or afternoon sessions.

The usual rules and duties around school attendance will come into force from 8 March. This includes mandatory attendance and the re-introduction of penalty fines for regular lateness and persistent absence. Please refer and adhere to the staggered timetable for arriving and collection of children already sent out. Please ask if you have any questions or concerns. Safety for all of us (pupils, parents and staff) is paramount and crucial to all our decision making. Together, we can each help to keep everyone as safe as is possible, following the rules and guidance provided.









In addition to all our precautions, school staff are able to continue to take two rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) tests each week at home to identify potential positive cases quickly and break the chains of transmission. The latest information is that parents and carers of school aged children will now also be able to undertake these tests at home too. Together with the roll out of the vaccination programme, there is light at the end of the tunnel but only if we continue to remain alert and follow the guidance stringently.

Last week, together with other local Headteachers, Mrs Anderson and Mr Archer met with Kate Griffiths (Burton and Uttoxeter's MP) via a virtual meeting to discuss the safe return of the children to school. The local MP thanked everyone for their hard work.
