- All children in school will be watching a live music concert next week.
- The whole school had a William Shakespeare week where we took part in drama, watched a performance by professional actors and took part in activities surrounding the arts and possibilities (e.g. set design, composing, costume design)
- We had a poetry week competition focused on a piece of Art about saving the environment
- Year 6 have worked with RicNic to take part in a drama project and improve their skills
- We celebrated World Book Day as a school which involved lots of art activities.
















Shakespeare week
